**Experienced Missionary Writes Second Children's Story With Moral of Self-Worth**

GARLAND, TX. ( USA ) –Texas native Viola Palmer has drawn on her years of experience as a Southern Baptist missionary in Honduras to write a children's story that demonstrates how people, even children, who feel alone and worthless can find hope and love through God.

This rapidly moving fiction book, *The Daughter of No One*, tells the story of Welki, a 9-year-old Miskito Indian girl who lives on the border of Honduras and Nicaragua during a tumultuous Nicaraguan government change. Welki calls herself "the daughter of no one" because her parents left her to live with her grandparents, who in turn sent her away to work in Honduras. The story follows her physical, emotional and spiritual journey to find where and to whom she belongs.

Welki's adventures include doing everyday chores, listening to exciting stories told by her grandmother, playing in the river, hiding in a ditch from bombs, running from the police and more. Throughout her expedition, Welki discovers who she is and what she can do. She learns to respect others and trust in God, who shows that He loves her and cares about her.

Palmer's first book, *The Man in the Green Jeep*, released in 2006, tells the story of Chico, a child in a poor Honduran town who is sent over the mountain to get help for his starving village. The help that arrives, in the form of compassionate missionaries, not only brings life-sustaining food and water but also the love of God.

Palmer, and her husband, Jim, have been career missionaries for 25 years, serving in both Honduras and Nicaragua. Previously she served as children's minister.
